What is the Invest in Education Program?

The Invest in Education program is a granting program aimed at connecting commercial customers with educational institutions. The Invest in Education Program gives commercial companies that purchase new seats of the most current version of qualifying Autodesk software the right to grant a classroom lab of Autodesk software to the educational institution of their choice—a grant worth up to US\$25,000. The Invest in Education Program is part of Autodesk’s ongoing commitment to its educational and commercial customers in helping to foster the next generation of designers.

What is the benefit to my business?

The Invest in Education Program is an excellent way for commercial users of Autodesk products to give something back to their local educational institutions, which are a tremendous source of future employees for those same companies. Moreover, customers will be making a connection with their local community, helping build the next generation of engineers and designers in their area. How does the Invest in Education Program work?

- A commercial customer purchases new seats, upgrades or cross-grades of qualifying Autodesk software.
- Customer identifies an educational institution of their choice to receive a grant of Autodesk software for their classroom.
- The customer will receive an email from an Autodesk Representative confirming their donation.

What are the restrictions and guidelines of this program?

- One grant of a qualifying software product per school.
- Grants may be split between institutions in 5 seat increments only. Therefore, if a customer purchases 12 seats of software it would only count as 2 separate grants.
- Software granted is “Not for Resale” (NFR) and is not upgradeable to future releases and recipients are not eligible to purchase Subscriptions.
- Post-Secondary schools only are eligible for this program.
- Qualifying commercial software purchased must be the most current software release available.
- Autodesk Subscription is not included with this grant.
- Program available in the US and Canada only.

What are the start and end dates of this program?

Start date: April 15, 2005.

End date and Submission Deadline: Program will remain open until further notice.
